The course was developed to encourage inmates to learn a new trade, particularly creative, even if the surroundings are not very easy. We have our shop, which sells to the public in Venice (the shop name BANCO 10). Since I have been teaching the ladies, their work has been featured in tourist guide books (Routard) and also in fashion magazines in Germany, USA and Denmark. We also produce handbags as fashion garments. Last year we produced the handmade costume for the main character "Rosina" from the play The Barber of Silvia which was held at the Venetian Opera House, La Fenice.

I work as a part time tailor, helping altering the costumes and dressing the Artists who are performing in productions such as Madam Butterfly – Tosca – Nabucco – Traviata - Barbiere di Silvia.

All pattern developments were produced on the computer system, Gerber.

I worked on the women's line for larger sizes, from designs, fittings and alterations. These garments were also semi couture and finished by hand. They are also famous for

Worked on women's line. The designer was very modern and the dresses were only made in black. The ideas came from the south of Italy taken from the widows and the way they dressed. His dresses were shown around the world and had created a lot

of publicity.

I worked with one of the most famous fashion designers in the late Eighties. He produced beautiful day and evening dresses for the rich and famous which were all created by hand. One of his most famous accolades during my time there was being asked to create the collection for the Princess of Wales's official trip to America and I worked on one of the dresses. These

dresses were also completely made by hand.
